Monday Bridge It must be remembered that Monday is an OPEN DAY and players of all abilities are welcome to play. It is nice when stronger players partner a new player, but this is not compulsory. Two Grand Masters can play together if they wish. The only restriction on the Monday players is that they must play the Simple System.

<u>**Cross Imp Pairs</u>** Several players approached the Play Committee and asked that the Wednesday Cross Imp Pairs be deleted from the calendar. This request was granted. A pity really, for this method of scoring favours sensible steady bridge enabling players to practise for Teams play.</u>



It gave the newer players a chance to score well and it provided a change from our everyday game. Many good players regard IMP scoring as "Real Bridge".

Ah well..... "Sic transit gloria mundi" _

When the bidding is over, make your opening lead BEFORE you enter the contract in your scorecard. And if you are Dummy, put your cards on the table – AND THEN enter the contract in your personal scoresheet.

Col Gale has just returned after 4 weeks overseas. He has decided to retire from his Club duties and we thank him for his cheerful and helpful service over the years.

Card Play The Law relating to the play of a card is a very simple one. "When it is your turn to play, you detach a card from your hand and place it on the table." The key phrase is "When it is your turn to play....." This means

you should not prematurely have a card ready and half out of your hand. This is illegal and will give unauthorised information to your partner – particularly if you decide you'd like to play a different card. WAIT – until it is your turn to play, and then select your card. As Dummy you must wait until Declarer nominates a card – even if it is a singleton.

<u>Too fast !</u> Players have been complaining that some players turn their cards over too quickly. You must wait until all four cards played to the trick are in view, before turning over the card.

<u>May I see those cards again ?</u> Once all four cards have been turned over, no one is allowed to ask to see the cards again, but if one player still has his card exposed he can ask to see the cards played to that trick.

Opening lead With regard to the opening lead, it must be faced down on the table, and not turned over until acknowledgement by partner. This is not to prevent an opening lead out of turn as many players suppose, but it is to allow question time about the bidding. In Ballina

it is usual to say "Thank you Partner" and then play commences, but in most other parts of the world, players say, "No questions, Partner" before the card is faced.



Ofcourse, this action should prevent the lead coming from the wrong hand.

<u>Unintended Call or Insufficient Call</u> We all commit this offence every now and again. If you do make an error in the bidding, it is important **<u>not</u> to announce WHY** you committed the infraction. This conveys Unauthorised Information to your partner and he may



not be allowed to bid again. So if you make a wrong call, simply call the Director and no account announce to the table at large <u>why</u> you got it wrong. Do not say, "Oh I

did not see your Club opening partner" or "Oh, I thought you bid 2♥, I did not realise it was 2NT" or words to that effect.

It's a Dog's Life A man walked by a table in a hotel and noticed three men and a dog playing bridge.

"That is a very smart dog," the man commented. "He's not so smart," said one of the players. "Every time he gets a good hand he wags his tail and gives his partner Unauthorised Information."



Re the Malaysian and Singapore Trip



Seven Ballina bridge players and one brave nonplaying husband joined up with two bridge players from Darwin to form a group of ten who travelled and played bridge at a number of clubs in Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur and Kuching) and Singapore. Usually six or eight players played at each location.

All the events were held in exclusive clubs which meant we usually played in salubrious surroundings and had morning/afternoon teas that were simply sinful.
