Report from the NSW State Teams Finals.

Marjorie Askew, Bill Powell, Eric Hurley and I travelled to Sydney to compete in this event. Eight teams participated – three Country Teams and five Metropolitan teams. We played a Round Robin and played a 12 board match against each other team. The top two teams qualified to play off for the State title.

In 2007, our team actually made through to be one of the finalists, but alas – this was not to be the case this year. I played particularly poorly in most of the qualifying rounds and made several errors – largely due to inefficient concentration and lack of dedication to the task in hand.

My worst error of the day involved a Roman Keycard Blackwood auction. We had Spade agreement as trumps, Eric bid 4NT and I responded 5♦ (3 or none – I got that bit right). Eric then bid 5♥ asking "Do you have the Queen of Spades". I held the Queen of Spades, but focussed on the Heart suit. No – no ♥ Queen in my hand – so I PASSED!! Eric played in 5♥ going off 6, for minus 600, instead of 6♠ for plus 1430! And I am happy to report the opponents misdefended - otherwise it would have been minus 700.

I must congratulate *Eric* on his demeanour during the tragic hand. He calmly played 5♥ going off 6 (when slam in Spades is laydown) as if it were a perfectly normal everyday



situation. And there were no recriminations or reproaches at the end of the hand.

Multi Two's seem to have gone the way of Holden cars, and most of our opponents were playing a simple, but very aggressive form of weak Two's. They have discarded the tenets of Weak Two's which have been sacrosanct for many years. Who needs a six card suit – five will do! Who needs two of the top three honours – 6 to the 9 will do? Voids? Four cards in the other Major? - all gone!

We missed the Ballina Bridge Club Christmas party, but the NSWBA party was held while we were there, so we were able to partake of their generous festive fare.
