Bidding Boxes



For example Ray Ghioni tells us he has 'grip' problems but he worked out what works for him: he just takes the one bidding 'card' out of the box; and then he doesn't find it too difficult to reconcile the cards into the bidding box at the end of the auction.

Many are telling us the cards are somewhat slippery; this may because they're brand new. At the Gold Coast Congress this week (where we have the same bidding boxes) we've noticed a few slipping onto the floor......

(+ Some background context: Bidding boxes were introduced by the WBF (World Bridge Federation) around 50 years ago. At about the same time Australia (and New Zealand) went to written bidding, and, as far as we're aware, are the only countries to do so. The WBF is now moving to tablets, + on the subject of tablets the next edition of Bridgemates are also like tablets....)




Library Matters

RESTRICTED PAIRS FINAL ROUND ONE - IGNORING THE SETBACKS

While he was stationed in Sri Lanka and working with the Australian Foreign Service, Bob Hart and his wife, Carolyn, played rubber bridge. They returned to Australia in 1985, and in 2000 they discovered the Ballina Bridge Club in the Northern NSW. They are now tournament players, attending the Gold Coast Congress on occasion.

On Sunday at the 2018 edition of the GCC, the Harts qualified for the A Final of the Restricted Pairs with a couple of good games.

In the first session of the final on Sunday, the Harts had several below-average results – some of it bad luck – but they made up for the negatives with some good boards to get to about average.

The first board out of the box was a bit unlucky for the couple.



Answer 1: Swiss Pairs [Roger & Miroslava (Mirka) and Lindt & Sprüngli. (5,5)]

Explanation - The Federers and the chocolate makers in a bridge contest where they should meet opponents at their own level. (Miroslava was originally Slovakian,- I know!)

Answer 2: Support [Drink left by sailor when late queen abandons Soccer fan. (7)] Explanation - A fit with partner

Nice Play

You are sitting North with an eight loser hand and choose to Pass in first seat. Partner is quite competitive in the auction but East/West win the contract. After the opening lead of the ♥10 and dummy being tabled this is what you see. Hmmmm...



Declarer calls for the ♥8 from dummy and you have to decide which card to play. "Third hand high" would suggest the ♥A. However, you are not a slave to all-purpose rules and treat them more as advice.

Declarer surely has the ♥Q, partner's lead would not make any sense from a suit headed by the Q10. You would like your ♥A to capture the ♥K rather than "beating thin air". Accordingly, you play small and allow declarer's ♥Q to win the first trick.

The play is fairly uncomplicated from this point onwards. Declarer draws trumps in two rounds with

partner's ♣Q dropping on the second round. Declarer now plays the ♠A and then the ♠K. Partner's ♠Q drops on the second round which means that your ♠98 are the top cards in the suit. Declarer ruffs a Spade and the lead is now in the dummy. A small Diamond from the table and you must play the ♠Q. Partner thinks for a moment and overtakes with their ♠A.

Now the moment you imagined way back at trick one. Partner leads a small Heart and your ♥AJ are sitting over dummy's ♥K for two tricks. The ♦K in your hand is high. Declarer is one down for a score of +50.

The key was to play low at trick one which gives up a trick now in order to get two tricks later. If you take the ♥A at trick one, then declarer has two Heart tricks and their contract. Good, thoughtful, defence saves the day.

Meanwhile, not a million miles away a declarer has this situation at trick one.



With the ♥K in dummy and the Queen in your hand, it seems obvious to play low. If North knows "third hand high" then you get two tricks in the suit. Before calling for the "obvious" small card from

dummy you pause for thought. Is



there a better plan? What do you know? Firstly, South will not have the ♥J, If they lead the ♥10 when they hold the ♥J10 they will make life very difficult for their partner to know what is going on. You reason that North must have both the Ace and the Jack.

Play the ♥K from dummy. North can have their ♥A ... you are never stopping that from happening. The advantage is that you now have a finesse against North's known ♥J.

North now cashes the ◆K and then the ◆Q before exiting with a Spade.

Declarer wins the ♠A (Resolution #3), draws trumps in two rounds and then leads the ♥9 from dummy to take the successful finesse. Ten tricks, well played.

Good, thoughtful, declarer play saves the day.

Of course, I am sure you have noticed, the two hands displayed are the same board.

Did you notice how important the ♥8 was? If South started with the ♥108 and West with ♥K94 then the defence shown first is guaranteed of success ... when declarer leads from dummy the presence of the ♥8 with South makes the ♥7 in the North hand a winner! Don't bemoan your lack of points until you are certain that there is not a stray seven or eight somewhere which is the key to the hand!
